Donovan and Ras go on the record ...

TWO Bermudian brothers are making news this week, one in the world of gospel and the other in the area of international photography.

Troy Donovan and Ras Mykkal are the sons of Bermudian Jean Simons, who has lived in Shelbyville, Tennessee for the past six years.

Troy also lives in Shelbyville, and he has this week released a CD of gospel recordings under his stage name of Donovan.

Mrs. Simons, who manages her son's musical career, reported that Troy has been performing in Puerto Rico and near his Shelbyville home, at community functions.

"This recording project is a strong effort on Troy's behalf to achieve his goal as a traveiling gospel performing artist," Mrs. Simons said. "He is very hopeful of

performing in Bermuda, his home country," she added.

Troy is currently working as a freelance graphic artist. He designed the cover and liner notes of his new CD, which follows an earlier recording he released on cassette.
